



Bradycardia With Pulses

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- Symptomatic bradycardia exists clinically when the following 3 criteria are present:
1) The HR is slow (< 60/min), 2) The pt has symptoms, and 3) The symptoms are due to the slow HR.
- Bradycardia that causes symptoms is typically < 50/min. The pts cardiac rhythm should be interpreted in the context of symptoms, and atropine/transcutaneous pacing administered only for symptomatic bradycardia.
